In Memory of David Backes

It is impossible, of course. To find the words to sum up a life. A personality, a career, an impact. A friendship.

My friend and yours, David J. Backes, Sigurd Olson's exceptional biographer, passed away very unexpectedly this past December 23. His service was held on January 14. David was only 65. He published 6 books about Sig and the North Woods. But those are just numbers, even more inadequate than words in any sort of summing up.

So we will try with words, for they are all we have, save perhaps a mute monument, or a piece of art or music.

David and I had a special bond. As very young men, rather lost and looking for direction and guidance, we both—within weeks of each other—wrote to a writer named Sigurd F. Olson. Each of us received a warm and encouraging letter back—almost immediately—that changed the direction of our lives. Neither of us knew this about the other until years later. Then, over the course of conversations, letters, emails, and phone calls, we established a connection that felt almost more like brothers than mere friends.

We encouraged and sympathized with one another about the ups and downs of the writing life and the publishing world. We shared notes about families and the ongoing journey of life. We recalled with gratitude and wonderment the eerily similar effect Sig had had on each of our lives. We shared interest and praise for one another's new books and projects. And sometimes we just chatted.

Yet we somehow never got to spend a lot of personal time together. We never paddled a canoe at sunrise together, or walked down a forest path, or sat on a rock and quietly watched the sunset. And I will always regret that. Yet those are private moments I know he shared deeply with others, especially his family.

For David was truly a family man. I had my own limited window into his life, and the broader world knew him as a teacher at the University of Wisconsin Milwaukee, and as a writer of books. But David's wife of more than four decades, Judi, along with his children Tim, Heidi, Jenny, and Andrew, and grandkids Rosalie, Lily, Charlie, Malachi, Jack, and Walter, all knew the most private and authentic David. Dad. Grandpa. And the David they speak of is exactly the same man I knew and admired so deeply for his many wonderful qualities. Just more so.

In speaking with Tim and Jenny, in talking with current LPF President Patsy Mogush, and Executive Director Steffi (O'Brien) Huberty, all the same words keep coming up, again and again. Which is a remarkable thing. Those words, in no particular order, are: Gentle. Humble. Kind. Generous. Wise. Genuine.

Steffi speaks of calling David whenever she needed a little life-advice or had some sort of problem to deal with. He was, she said, often her "first call." His responses were



always "fulsome" A word we do not hear too often these days—but just the right one, for it denotes the ability to listen closely, to empathize deeply, and to respond not just with words but with an emotional capacity that is rare. Steffi says she could listen to David "literally for hours," whether he was talking about Sig, or the North Woods, or any subject at all, and she feels that his own emotional depth was the reason he was the perfect biographer for a complex subject like Sig Olson. Steffi says, in three pure and simple words, "I loved David."

Patsy recalls meeting and hearing David for the first time at an LPF dinner where David was the featured speaker. She remembers that during one part of his presentation, in recalling something about Sigurd Olson, David got tears in his eyes. A moment so genuine and touching, she said, "I knew I would like him." Of course, her intuition was correct. Patsy and David later communicated often about the Foundation, about new initiatives and directions. And David—who had been deeply involved from LPF's earliest days—was always a source of helpful and encouraging advice. Patsy remembers David as a true mentor. And, like Steffi, says he was often "her first call."

Alanna Dore, beloved former LPF Executive Director, also remembers David as a wonderful resource—who sometimes stopped by the LPF booth at the Blueberry Festival to help. He was always available and warm, and sometimes funny. "I have a new granddaughter," he once told Alanna, "and she's a magician!" Oh? "Yes—she turned me into a grandpa!"

And so we return once more to families, and to efforts at summing up. As longtime LPF Vice-President Chuck Wick and I drove across wintry Wisconsin to attend David's service, we passed the hours telling stories, remembering our own interac-


Celebration, Caring, Change, and Challenge

Celebration! The Listening Point Foundation is 25 years old!

After the deaths of Elizabeth Olson and her husband Sigurd F. Olson, the author, educator, environmentalist, and wilderness advocate, the family needed to determine the future of the property on Burntside Lake named Listening Point.

Bob Olson, son of Sig and Elizabeth, wrote about the decision in his book *The Story of Listening Point*. "In 1998, friends and family decided that Listening Point was part of the regional and national heritage and that it should be preserved and protected. This should also include, as much as possible, the home of the author, the writing shack, memorabilia, and the legacy of wilderness education, thought, and writing. What to do? They finally decided that the best means to do so was to establish a trust or foundation that could carry on these goals and interests beyond their lifetimes. As a result, they formed a not-for-profit, charitable foundation guided by a Board of Directors and named The Listening Point Foundation, Inc. The Olson family then donated the property to the Foundation."



"The Listening Point Foundation will seek to carry on the Sigurd Olson legacy, his wilderness philosophy, his defense of the wilderness to our own spiritual health, and his example of public service to which he devoted his life.

The Listening Point Foundation is dedicated to the preservation of the historic and natural integrity of Listening Point for all time for the pleasure and inspiration of future generations. Listening Point is at once a place and an idea. It has become the Walden Pond of the Upper Midwest and for many others from all parts of the country and the world. Listening Point has become a touchstone, a setting of beauty and meaning where others can see and feel the world where Sigurd Olson himself walked, and worked, and wondered. As the owner and custodian of Listening Point, the Foundation provides a permanent authority and responsibility for its care and preservation.

The Foundation will join with others in the continuing campaign of wilderness education for both new and older generations. It recognizes that the promotion and defense of wilderness in the 21st century will require no less strength and vision than it has in the past. New and mighty challenges will require new degrees of cooperation and new insights by all sectors of society.

The special task of the Foundation will be to help meet the challenges of the 21st Century in two principal ways: first by engendering a sense of love and respect for what is still natural and wild; and second, by lifting the horizon of wilderness care and education from the local to the global, thus responding to new realities and following the evolution of Sigurd Olson's own thought and career. We shall, in effect, be starting out where he left off."

The Listening Point Foundation continues our work toward the mission and the vision that Sig envisioned for the wild areas and their intangible value for people, and that Bob envisioned for furthering Sig's quest through the Listening Point Foundation.

We will celebrate our 25th Anniversary at two main events. First, an outdoor Garden Party and Writing Shack Plaque Dedication at the Olson Home in Ely, MN on Saturday, July 22 (see page 4 for more info) and then at the LPF Fall Dinner on Friday, September 8, 2023 at the Grand Ely Lodge in Ely, MN.

Caring. The Listening Point Foundation is remembering two people who've devoted much time and thought and energy toward fulfilling Sigurd Olson's dreams. David Backes, Sigurd Olson's official biographer and author of several books (including *A Wilderness Within: The Life of Sigurd F. Olson*), and Mark Allsup, LPF board member who pioneered our strategic learning initiative, have both died in the past few months. Although our hearts are broken, we remember with gratitude their efforts to further the mission and vision of the Listening Point Foundation. Both David and Mark understood deeply the value of nature and the need to preserve wild places. Read more about each of these extraordinary men in this edition of the LPF newsletter.

Change. Steffi Huberty, who's been with us for more than five years, will be leaving her position as the Listening Point Foundation Executive Director to pursue her new adventure with designing and creating pottery. She will continue to be in touch and involved with the Foundation while living in Ely and operating her own business, studio, and storefront.

Steffi and her dad, Bill O'Brien, visited the Listening Point house and writing shack in the summer of 2015. After seeing Sig's maps on top of the file cabinets in the writing shack, Steffi, a student of cartography, returned several times to Ely to study the maps for an upcoming thesis. Those visits convinced the soon-to-retire Alanna Dore that Steffi should follow her as the Executive Director of the Listening Point Foundation.

It was a good decision! During her tenure with LPF, Steffi has moved the organization forward through technology, reaching out to **continued on page 3**

tions with David. We recalled his invaluable early assistance in setting up the Foundation, his initial trepidation in getting started with Sig's biography and the need to navigate sometimes treacherous Olson family waters. His early feelings of intimidation and later warm friendship and love for Sig's son and LPF founder Bob Olson. We discussed those early letters, and how a lost and fearful young man desperately needed direction from a mentor—and how after finding that direction and confidence, became a mentor to others and the honest and discerning voice of his hero. Somehow finding the words to put an amazing life into perspective.

After learning the news of David's passing, I had messaged Tim: "Your dad was one of the finest human beings I have had the privilege to know, and the world is a better place for him living in it. He shared that sweet, gentle spirit with everyone—

along with serious commitment, strength, and courage. Please remember—as your dad knew—that all which is best in us lives on. And he will do so in so very many ways."

But I think Tim himself put things in the best perspective in saying that his dad lived "in gratitude and celebration." Recalling that his very favorite phrase was, "All is abundance!" That he found a way to live that philosophy every day. That he "lived a life of abundant love for all, and left behind a legacy of immense wisdom, comfort, kindness, humility and gratitude."

That was the David Backes I knew. The man who wrote Sigurd Olson's life and helped to preserve his legacy. Who loved the natural world and fought to preserve its beauty. Who was a friend, a dad, a grandpa, a mentor. And I cannot imagine better words of summation.

We're grateful for Steffi's many contributions to the Listening Point Foundation, and her ongoing connection with Sigurd Olson and his vision.


The LPF Board of Directors is conducting a search for a new Executive Director who will work closely with Freja Finkle, our

Mark, always curious and planning the next adventure, began annual visits to the north woods of Minnesota, then to Listening Point, which led him to the Foundation. Mark served with a passion for preserving the properties, for creating a development plan to increase financial stability, and for inspiring the board to think toward the future through strategic learning. Mark was a good friend to many. I continue to hear his laughter, wish for phone calls, and watch for text messages. Communicating with him brought joy and new energy for our work with the Listening Point Foundation. After retiring from the board of directors in the summer of 2022, Mark arranged for LPF to receive a significant planned gift upon his death. He wanted to express his gratitude to the Listen-



ing Point Foundation, its people and its vision. We are grateful to Mark for his friendship, his generosity, and for his dedicated service to the organization. Our thoughts are with his partner Oliver and his family and many close friends.
